

Family Support, Right Away

Inspired by real experiences, Hear It Begins launched in October 2024. The program is designed to connect families to fast and personalized care immediately following their child's hearing loss diagnosis. Hear It Begins continues to grow, helping families make confident and informed decisions about their care.

A Family Affair

St. Joseph's Listening and Spoken Language (LSL) providers have two primary objectives: support families through the early years and help children transition successfully into their local schools. As a result, most families spend a short amount of time enrolled in St. Joseph services, often less than two years. But the Crews family in Missouri is a special exception to the rule.



Bethany and her husband Brett live in Barnhart, Missouri with their four children- three of whom have hearing loss. Malachi (6 years), Romen (2 years), and Zola (10 months) have all received care from St. Joseph Hearing + Speech, making the Crews' connection to St. Joseph a true family affair.

Although Malachi passed his newborn hearing screening, Bethany noticed that he was not reacting to loud sounds. She sought additional testing and received his hearing loss diagnosis. Malachi underwent cochlear implant surgery at 12 months old and later joined the Molloy Family Toddler Classroom.

From their first tour of St. Joseph's Missouri campus, Bethany and Malachi felt at home. "He just fit right in with everyone else," Bethany said, recalling how Malachi made fast friends

with his classmates. With his LSL Provider Barb Meyers, he began making immediate strides in his listening and language development. Now, Malachi is bright and independent first grader.

Romen took a different path to St. Joseph. Due to complications from Hirschsprung's disease, a congenital condition impacting the digestive system, the Crews had to travel to Washington, DC for specialized care and multiple surgeries. Once Romen was strong and healthy, the Crews had no doubts about where to look for hearing loss support. Bethany said, "We knew exactly who to go to and how to get started." Romen began LSL sessions with Early Intervention Specialist Lexi Newman and received his cochlear implants at 10 and 12 months old. He is currently a happy and social member of the Toddler class.

With Romen thriving in his care plan and Malachi succeeding in school, the Crews welcomed Zola, the youngest member of their family. They discovered her hearing loss immediately, and she began receiving support from St. Joseph just three days after her diagnosis. Zola began Early Intervention sessions with Newman before undergoing double cochlear implant surgery in September. Although her journey is just beginning, Bethany is optimistic about Zola's progress. "I'm excited to get her implants activated so when she screams, she can startle herself," Bethany joked.

Bethany had high praise for St. Joseph's family support efforts. "They help tremendously anytime that we need something," she said. When Malachi enrolled in his local school, the Outreach team supported the transition. When Romen began attending the daily Toddler class, Missouri leadership invited Bethany and Zola to stay in the building to avoid a 90-minute round-trip commute. And when Hallie, Bethany's 3-year-old daughter with typical hearing, comes along, the Toddler class teachers include her in classroom activities. "Everyone works together to make sure my kids are achieving their goals and feel welcome and comfortable," she said.

The next year is full of exciting changes for the Crews. In the spring, Malachi will begin playing Little League baseball. Romen is preparing to transition out of the Toddler class at the end of the year. Hallie shows an interest in gymnastics, and Zola will continue Early Intervention sessions with Newman and join the toddler class when she is old enough. Bethany and Brett are excited to continue watching their children grow and develop unique personalities. "They're happy, and that's all I want for them," Bethany said. No matter where the future takes the Crews, St. Joseph will be there to cheer them on.

Preschool/Primary School

St. Joseph's daily Auditory-Verbal Education programs place an emphasis on developing each student's auditory skills using their hearing technology. In the classroom, educators provide focused and individualized instruction through structured lesson plans and classroom activities. Our teachers and LSL providers combine standard academic instruction with intensive LSL intervention.

Outreach Services

St. Joseph offers continued, specialized support once a child leaves our Early Intervention or Preschool/Primary School programs. Outreach Specialists collaborate with local professionals to assess needs, set individualized goals and accommodations, and provide support in auditory skills, academics, and self-advocacy. Outreach services can be delivered in person or through iHear teletherapy.
